

Focus First - One Project At A Time


An exercise in best practice and productivity

On April 4th, IEI's Indianapolis staff shared a fun and enlightening exercise with one of its clients with the intent to share knowledge and a lean management tool. The exercise dealt with multi-tasking, and intended to unveil the many ways in which many corporate leaders, managers and staff often lose productivity and effective time, by constantly switching between tasks.

Leading the exercise, Dustin Quincy asked for two volunteers to approach a white board. Each volunteer was asked to complete separate "tasks" of creating sequential lists of 10 items in three columns. The first column was for numbers starting with "1". The second column was for letters starting with "A" and the third column was for Roman numerals starting with "I". The volunteers were told they were being timed by Alex Kline and Nick Bergman, and directed to complete each list sequentially, but must complete the next sequential item in each column before moving down the list (i.e. "1", "A", "I": "2", B", "II", etc.). The times for each participant were recorded and they were then asked to try it again by completing each individual column before moving to the next (1-10; A-J; then I-X).

The results of the exercise showed that it took approximately one-third of the time to focus on completing each individual "task" than it did by constantly switching through processes. Enlightened by the outcome of the exercise, everyone in the room collectively expressed the "Aha" that simply focusing on one project, one task, one email at a time – from start to finish – can significantly increase productivity. Additionally, there is less opportunity for error.

Ultimately, we all have the same 24 hours in each day to manage projects, emails, calls, and deadlines. A slight shift in behavior can recoup time and deliver better outcomes. This best practice is one that IEI leadership has also adopted into its culture and planning efforts and is sharing the knowledge to benefit others.

Chicago Riverwalk: The Project that Keeps on Giving

IEI and Alfred Benesch & Company (Benesch) jointly received the 2018 Illinois ACEC Eminent Conceptor Award for the engineering project of the year for the completion of the Chicago Riverwalk Project. IEI's Harish Goyal was the civil engineer of record as part of the design team, while Benesch led the construction engineering for the project. The Riverwalk Project also won Diamond Recognition from ACEC New York and national recognition, receiving a Grand Award from ACEC National.

The awards recognize Chicago Riverwalk as a project that provides residents and visitors with a World Class facility for eating, drinking and playing along Chicago's beautifully revitalized downtown riverfront.

The project plays a central role in enhancing the downtown Chicago public experience by giving visitors and residents a place to engage in recreation and leisure in the heart of the city. Creating park space out of underutilized industrial riverfront in a dense urban environment creates a healthier and happier environment for all Chicagoans. It is also part of a larger city-wide initiative to develop dynamic green spaces throughout the city, including recent projects like the 606 trail, Maggie Daley Park, and Navy Pier. These public spaces collectively help to keep Chicago competitive as a beautiful destination city.


