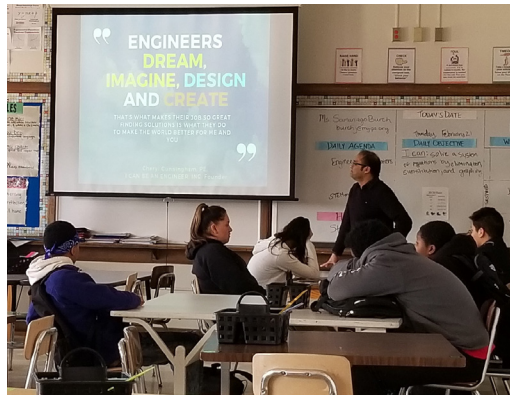

Spearheaded by IndyGo, a Municipal Corporation of Indianapolis – Marion County, and the largest public transportation provider in the state of Indiana, the Red Line Extension project is the development of an all-electric bus rapid transit (BRT) system with many features similar to light rail, including dedicated lanes and standalone stations. The first phase of a four-year plan to revitalize the City's transportation system, this 35-mile route is within a quarter mile of nearly 50,000 residents and 150,000 jobs, improving the quality of life for the City's residents and provides better access to opportunities. 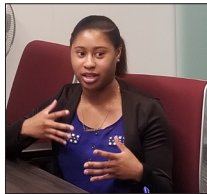
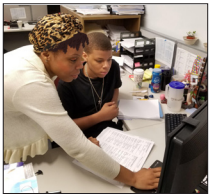
2019 Summer Internships and Shadow Day
